This raffle salt was handcrafted by Nantucket Basket-maker Maggie Silva. It is woven with cane over cobalt glass. The base, rim and handle are antique ivory. Maggie has written several Nantucket Basket instruction booklets. She teaches at her home studio in Raynham, MA and her work is sold at Hills of Nantucket. This red amber lacy salt was made by Boston & Sandwich from 1830-1850. It can be found in Neal's book on page 165. It is numbered OO 1 and is categorized as Very Rare.



This opalescent lacy salt was made by Boston & Sandwich from 1830-1850. It can be found in Neal's book on page 221. It is numbered OL 16a and is categorized as Extremely Rare.
